He began his legal career as a litigation associate with Finnegan in Atlanta.

Crumbley participated in some of the original post-grant trials conducted under the America Invents Act (AIA), and his portfolio includes authoring hundreds of decisions on AIA petitions and *ex parte* appeals.

During his role as a member of PTAB leadership, Crumbley advised the director of the US Patent and Trademark Office (USPTO) and played a role in major PTAB and agency reform efforts—including shaping the PTAB's consolidated trial practice guide and rulemaking on motions to amend Board decision-making procedures.
